

Call for student helpers

The project "Bottom-up and top-down drivers of herbivory" is searching for student helpers for field work in subtropical China in the summer 2019. The work is mainly arthropod collecting from trees, but other tasks will also be included. The study site is a planted forest located in Xingangshan mountains in southeast China. Fieldwork will be conducted in April, June and mid-August, about one month each time. We are looking for two student helpers for April, two for June and one for August. Preference will be given to an applicant that could join more than one of the trips.

What we are searching in a candidate are:

- Good English skills
- Flexibility
- Open-mindedness
- Interest toward arthropods

Since the work can be physically demanding (carrying and lifting equipment) and the field conditions challenging (mountains, hot and humid climate), good physical condition is also required. Previous field work experience is also advantageous.
